

In our commitment to transparency, Con Alma Health Foundation (CAHF) is sharing our Grant Making Committee's scoring rubric. This document outlines what reviewers consider when scoring applications, providing guidance to applicants.

SCORING DETAILS

Maximum Possible Points: 100

Do not leave a scoring field blank. To assign zero points, enter a zero.

Proposal

(Award up to 25 points based on these items)

- The request summary clearly describes work that could make a significant, positive impact on the health of people in New Mexico.
- The need or opportunity for the work proposed is clear, compelling, and timely.
- The proposal focuses on work that will promote system-level change and/or increase health equity.
- The proposed work has clear potential to advance or contribute to one or more CAHF funding priority(ies).

Organization

(Award up to 10 points based on these items)

- The organization demonstrates capability and/or experience to effectively accomplish the proposed work, including personnel with relevant skills and knowledge.
- There is an achievable plan to mobilize/leverage community resources toward accomplishing the proposed work.
- Collaborative aspects of this proposal are particularly strong and will bring more organizations into focusing on addressing the need/opportunity identified.

Beneficiaries

(Award up to 10 points based on these items)

- Prioritizes underserved, historically marginalized populations and/or those with identified health needs/deficits.
- Includes leadership, involvement, or important input from people within the communities that will benefit.

Geography

(Award up to 10 points based on these items)

- Proposed work will happen in a geographic area or community with inadequate resources, and/or will bring needed resources, experience and knowledge to the identified area.
- This work is likely to have a positive impact or effect in the geographic area(s) identified.

Budget

(Award up to 15 points based on these items)

- The activities described are likely to promote systems change.
- Successful accomplishment of these activities will likely achieve the expected outcomes.
- The budget presented shows a clear association between the allocation of expenses and the activities and timeline.
- Shows income/revenue adequate to support the efforts outlined in the proposal.

Outcomes

(Award up to 20 points based on these items)

- The outcomes expected will effectively address the need/opportunity identified and are achievable within the scope of the funding (see also the "Proposal" tab.)
- Clear methods are in place to measure outcomes and report on achievements, effectively showing the impact of the funding.
- The impact of this work could continue well after the grant period.

Discretionary

Assign up to 10 points to this proposal for reasons YOU think it is particularly fund-worthy, and please explain in the "Discretionary Notes" below.
