# Message from Leadership

"We are grateful for the dedication of our Board of Trustees and staff. We offer our heartfelt gratitude to all our volunteers and the outstanding nonprofits who work to make a lasting impact on health in our state." Dear Friends,

This past year was a milestone year for Con Alma Health Foundation.

We invested nearly \$2 million into rural areas and communities facing challenges in New Mexico, focusing on addressing health inequities. In our commitment to community led solutions we implemented community grant reviewers to amplify the voices of community leaders in our annual grant review process. We awarded twenty-eight <a href="#">CAHF statewide</a> grants and 9 <a href="#">Northern New Mexico Health Grants</a> Group (NNMHGG) grants, totaling \$800,000.

Through a generous gift from Mackenzie Scott in 2022, we were able to award \$950,000 in Multi-Year Grants to three organizations to advance maternal health in New Mexico: Think NM, Project ECHO and Searchlight New Mexico. These grants address the provider shortage in New Mexico, accessible training for rural healthcare providers, and awareness of the maternal health desert in New Mexico. These strategies are intended to expand our health care systems and create greater access for all New Mexicans as we continue to explore how to invest these funds into New Mexico.

We also honored two <u>Heroes of Health</u> for their extraordinary contributions to the health of their communities. **Lisa Patch**, Director of Health Services for Alamogordo Public Schools, was honored for her creativity and commitment to her students and families, as seen by her work to convert an RV into a mobile health unit to bring the school nurse to students at home during the height of the pandemic. **Rayven Ward**, a youth from <u>Rio Communities</u>, was honored for her extensive fundraising and advocacy work to protect the environment, animal welfare, youth mental health and outdoor education.

Congratulations to both Heroes of Health!

As we continue to grow and evolve as an organization, we are grateful for the dedication of our Board of Trustees and staff. We offer our heartfelt gratitude to all our volunteers and the outstanding nonprofits who work to make a lasting impact on health in our state.


